What is a Brown Recluse Spider?

Brown recluse spiders are venomous spiders typically found in the central and southern United States. Brown recluse spiders have a dark, violin-shaped mark just behind their heads. This mark can be hard to see, so it's easy to mistake a different kind of brown spider for a brown recluse.

What Causes a Brown Recluse Spider to Bite?

Brown recluse spiders aren't aggressive spiders and will only bite if they are trapped against skin. They usually hide during the day and come out at night to hunt for insects.

How Can I keep Brown Recluse Spiders Out Of My Home

- Keep your home free of clutter
- Avoid using bed skirts
- Seal up all areas where a spider could enter
- Keep woodpiles and trash cans away from the house
- Store tools and hand-held outdoor equipment in tightly sealed plastic bags to avoid spider encounters

Brown Recluse often live in dark, sheltered areas, such as piles of wood, leaves, or rocks. They may also live inside your home or under the porches. Sometimes a brown recluse will even hide in shoes or under clothes that have been lying on the floor for a long time.
